In celebration of Canada's centennial of flight, this once in 100 years 2 day kite-making workshop is being offered to a limited number of participants on a first come, first served basis.

Kite-maker Bill Wilson and fabric artist Anne Morrell will guide this workshop providing the inspiration and expertise required for each participant to design and construct a Rokkaku kite.

Rokkaku kites originated in Japan. These 6-sided kites are taller than they are wide and known for their flying ability.

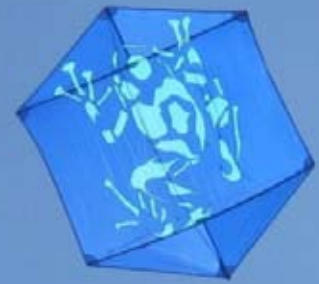
Kite kit included but participants must bring their own basic sewing supplies and sewing machine capable of doing zigzag.

A founding member of the Canadian Kite Federation, Bill Wilson is an avid kite flyer and designer from Halifax, Nova Scotia who has been collecting and building kites since 2003. For the past 6 years, Bill has been traveling to kite festivals across North America filling the skies with color, making new friends and learning from other kite designers. He has written and presented a number of tutorials and workshops on subjects including appliqué and construction techniques to large kites used for kite aerial photography.

## *Anne Morrell Robinson*

Anne Morrell Robinson is an award winning fibre artist who is best known for her original appliqué quilts inspired by history, whimsy, and nature. She also creates hooked rugs, art dolls, floor cloths and wearable art available at her studio, King Ross Quilts and Fibre Art, in Margaree Valley, Cape Breton Island. In this workshop she will apply her design ideas into flying art. Anne has been teaching all over North America for conferences, guilds, schools and retreats since the mid 1970's. Her teaching philosophy is to let each student's creativity emerge and become personal art.
